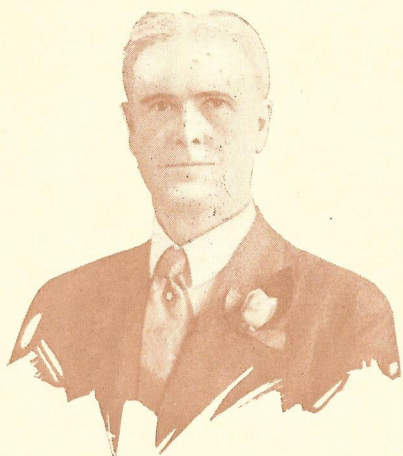

PROCLAMATION

City of Oshkosh, Wisconsin

Office of Mayor

To the People of the City of Oshkosh—

Recalling the kind deeds of that distinguished *Man of Peace*, that Brave Warrior and Protector—CHIEF OSHKOSH—who so nobly protected the early white settlers here against hostile tribes and in so many ways befriended and aided them in their Pioneer Life, and in founding this City—OSHKOSH—which bears his name, it is eminently fitting and proper, and a Pleasure this day to welcome his Grandchildren and Members of the Menominee Tribe, and set apart this Half Memorial Day.

I therefore request that the afternoon of Tuesday, May 25, 1926, be dedicated thruout the City of Oshkosh as a Special Day for expressing our Gratitude and honoring the great Chieftain whose name we bear. I urge all the people to observe the day.

Let the outpouring of the people of Oshkosh indicate the measure of their gratitude and love, to signalize the day as being devoted to such kindly mission in throwing garlands of flowers, and in paying Tributes of Love, to that Distinguished American—CHIEF OSHKOSH.

May his Crypt and Tomb in Menominee Park always be a revered and hallowed Shrine to visit and honor.

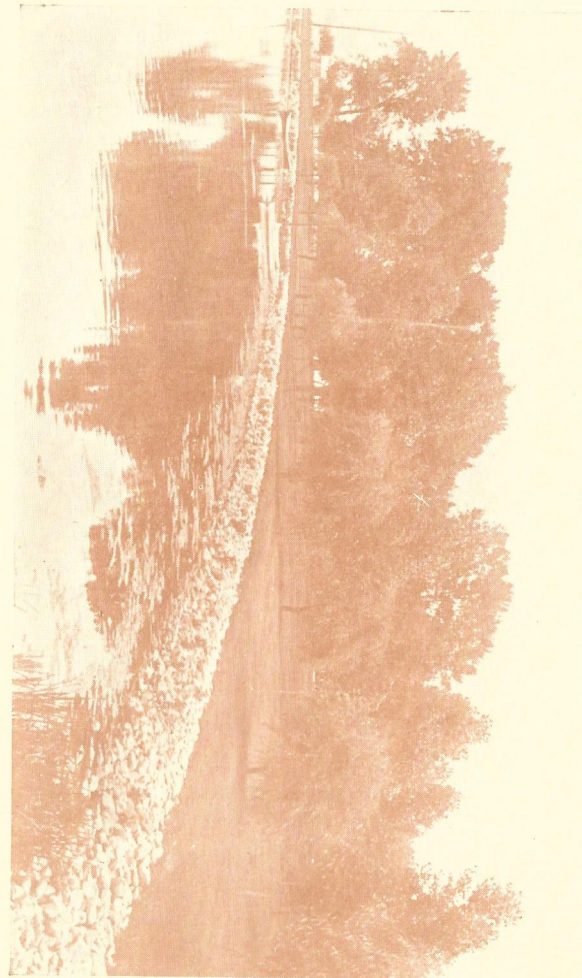

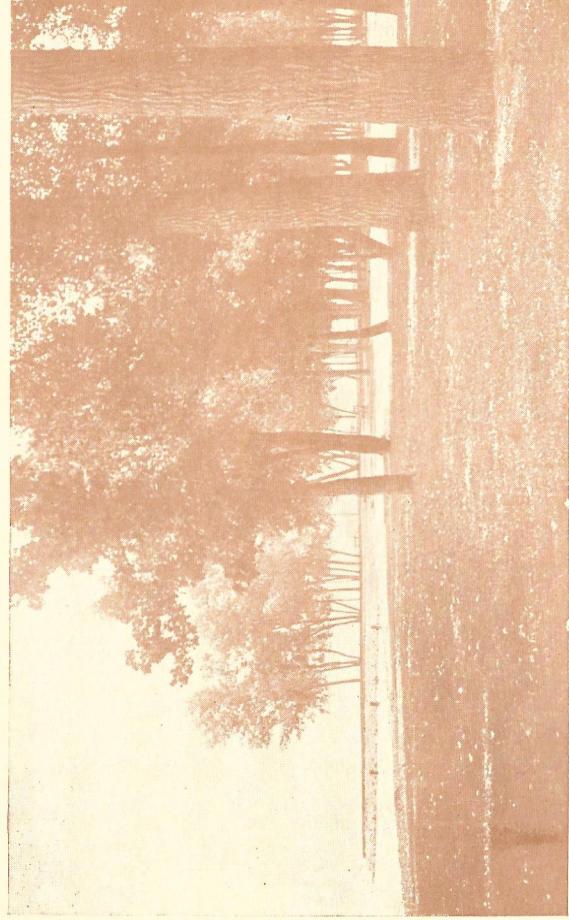

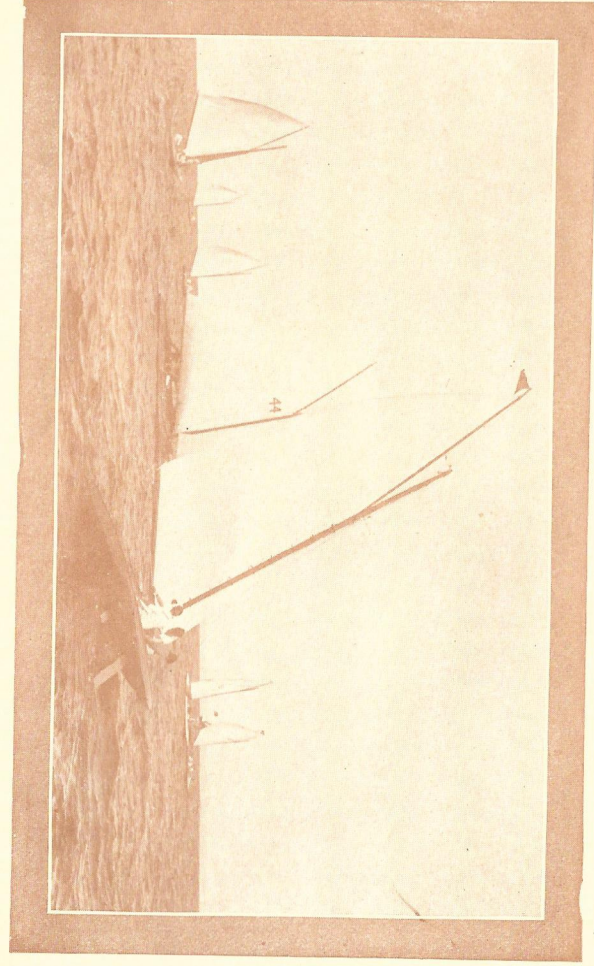
